## Pupil Premium Report 2020-2021

The Pupil Premium is funding provided to schools which is additional to main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), a smaller amount allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been 'Looked After' (in care) for 6 months or more. In 2012, funding was extended to include pupils who have been eligible for free school meals (Ever6).

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils, they are responsible for educating. However, schools have to be accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. From September 2012, it became a requirement for this information to be published on the school website. Please see below information regarding how the Schools spent Pupil Premium funding in the 2020-2021 academic year.

## **Objectives for Pupil Premium in this School:**

- 1. The Pupil Premium is used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and raise the standard of achievement for these pupils.
- 2. The funding is used to close the gap in achievement of these pupils and their peers.
- 3. As far as its powers allow, the school uses the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others.
- 4. We endeavor to ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most, so that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives.

### **School Policy**

The Headteacher and Governing body have agreed a policy for Pupil Premium to guide the use of funds and to ensure that it represents value for money.

### Accountability

The Headteacher and leadership team regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies we have put into place for Pupil Premium and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact.

### Statistics

In school we currently have (academic year 2020-2021):
